Similes & Metaphors

- While both similes and metaphors are used to make comparisons, the difference between similes and metaphors comes down to a word.
 - \circ Similes use the words $\ensuremath{\textbf{like}}$ or $\ensuremath{\textbf{as}}$ to compare things.
 - "Life is like a box of chocolates."
 - \circ $\,$ In contrast, metaphors $\mbox{directly}$ state a comparison.
 - "Love is a battlefield."
